# OFF-LICENCE

# Sections 17 and 64

**Pursuant** to the Sale and Supply of Alcohol Act (the Act), <u>SVJ COMPANY LIMITED</u> (the licensee) is authorised to sell and supply alcohol, on the premises situated at **15 Beresford Street, Christchurch**, and known as "SUPER LIQUOR BRIGHTON", to any person for consumption off the premises and to supply alcohol free, as a sample, for consumption on the premises.

If this licence is not endorsed under section 40 of the Act, the licensee is also authorised to sell alcohol on or from the premises and deliver it somewhere else.

The authority conferred by this licence must be exercised through a manager or managers appointed by the licensee in accordance with Subpart 7 of Part 2 of the Act.

#### CONDITIONS

- a) No alcohol is to be sold or delivered on Good Friday, Easter Sunday, Christmas Day or before 1pm on Anzac Day.
- b) Alcohol may only be sold or delivered on the following days and during the following hours:

### MONDAY TO SUNDAY 10.00 AM TO 9.00 PM

- c) Water must be freely available to customers, while alcohol is being supplied free as a sample on the premises.
- d) The following steps must be taken to ensure that the provisions of the Act relating to the sale of alcohol to prohibited persons are observed:
  - i) Display of appropriate signs adjacent to every point of sale detailing the statutory restrictions on the supply of alcohol to minors and the complete prohibition on sales to intoxicated persons
- e) The following steps must be taken to ensure that the provisions of the Act relating to the management of the premises concerned are observed:
  - i) Alcohol must only be sold and supplied on the premises in accordance with the premises plan submitted with the application.
  - ii) The licensee must implement and maintain the steps proposed in their host responsibility policy.
- The whole of the premises is designated as a supervised area.

## SECTION 117 - OTHER DISCRETIONARY CONDITIONS

The following steps must be taken to promote the responsible consumption of alcohol:

- i) The licensee must implement and maintain the steps proposed in their host responsibility policy aimed at promoting the reasonable consumption of alcohol.
- ii) There shall be no sales of Nitro
- iii) The individual sale of packaged mainstream beer is not permitted; these products must remain in their original multipack form and cannot be broken up for single-unit sale. Ready-to-drink (RTD) beverages must be sold in packs of no fewer than four units. Any single units of beer or cider not covered by the above restrictions excluding craft beer must be sold at a minimum price of \$6.50 per unit.
- iv) Sales of fill your own type beers shall not be permitted.
- v) There shall be no external promotional advertising on the store except the store name and the franchise name.
- vi) A new livery will be installed on the external of the store as similar as possible to the mock-up presented. This shall be completed within 12 months of the date of this decision.
- vii) There shall be two staff on duty at the store at all times it is open for business.
- viii) The store will comply with the alcohol ban restrictions, its Visual Amenity Policy, its Social Responsibility Policy, its Harm Minimisation Policy and its Community Engagement Policy.

### OTHER RESTRICTIONS AND REQUIREMENTS TO BE NOTED ON THE LICENCE

Section 56 – Display of signs; Section 57 – Display of licences; Section 59 - Requirements relating to remote sales by holders of off-licences; Section 214 – Manager to be on duty at all times and responsible for compliance

### DURATION

Subject to the requirements of the Act relating to the payment of fees, and to the provisions of the Act relating to the suspension and cancellation of licences, this licence continues in force—

- a) either
  - i) until the close of the period for which it was last renewed; or
  - ii) if it has never been renewed, until the close of the period of 12 months after the day it was issued; but
- b) if an application for the renewal of the licence is duly made before the licence would otherwise expire, either
  - i) until the close of the period of 3 years after the period for which it was last renewed; or
  - ii) if it has never been renewed, until the close of the period of 4 years after the day it was issued.

# THE LICENCED PREMISES

The premises are identified on the plan provided with the application for a licence.
